You can still telephone the surgery outside normal surgery hours as you will be directed to an Out of Hours Service (OOHs). The OOHs period is 6.00pm to 8am on weekdays, and all day at weekends and bank holidays. You can also call the OOHs service direct: 111 which can give you advice or direct you to the best local service to treat your injury. **In a life threatening emergency, please dial 999.**

 Conditions that can be treated at the unit	
wounds - cuts and bruises (tetanus immunisation can also be given) bites - human, insect and animal minor burns and scalds muscle and joint injuries - strains and sprains, limb fractures sports injuries emergency contraception	eye problems ear-ache (patients over 2 years old) cystitis (not children or male patients) minor head injuries (with no loss of consciousness) minor head injuries injuries to the back, shoulder and chest
